



## **Biography for Colonel Jacob N. Haynes**

Colonel Jacob N. Haynes entered the Army as a Transportation Officer in 1978 after graduating from Winston Salem State University. In more than 22 years of active military service, Colonel Haynes has held an array of significant Transportation and Acquisition positions.

As a Transportation officer, he served as a Platoon leader and Executive Officer, 628<sup>th</sup> Transportation Company, Battalion Maintenance Officer 180<sup>th</sup> Transportation Battalion, and Company Commander, 418 Transportation Truck Company at FT. Hood, Texas. He commanded the 2<sup>nd</sup> Movement Region, 25<sup>th</sup> Transportation Command, Korea. COL Haynes was later assigned as advisor and Group S-3 for the 1175<sup>th</sup> Transportation Terminal Brigade in New Jersey.

Col Haynes first assignment as an Acquisition Officer followed his graduation as distinguished graduate from the Army Logistics Management Course at Ft Lee, VA. He was assigned at the Army Operational Test and Evaluation Command as the principle evaluator for major transportation systems such as the Heavy Equipment Transport System (HETS) and Family of Medium Tactical Vehicles (FMTV).

In June 1993, Col Haynes was assigned as the Assistant Project manager for the Tactical Quiet Generator Program, PM Mobile Electric Power. PM Mobile Electric power was awarded the Secretary of the Army PM of the year in the Project Management Category.

In November 1996, Col Haynes assumed the position as the central selected PM for the CONUS Freight management System and Automated Air load Planning System, Military Traffic Management Command. Following this Battalion level Command, COL Haynes was assigned as the Project manager for the Transportation Coordinated Automated Management System II (TCAIMS II) by the Under Secretary of Defense for Transportation Policy.

Col Haynes has a B.S. from Winston Salem State University, and a MBA in Acquisition Management from Monmouth University. His Military education include: Masters in Strategic Studies from the United States Army War College. Transportation Officer basic and advance courses, Material Acquisition course, Command General Staff college, Defense System Management College, Program Management Course and United States Army War College.

Col Haynes decorations include the Meritorious Service medal with 6 oak leaf clusters, Army Commendation medal, Army achievement medal and overseas ribbon.
