Subj: SHIPYARD TOTAL ASSET VISIBILITY (SYTAV) PROGRAM

Ref: (a) MOA MAT/TAV Version 2.0 of 24 April 2003
(b) NAVSEA Letter Ser 04L432/141 of 12 March 2004

1. Reference (a) noted that the purpose of the SYTAV Program was to provide each shipyard with visibility of the nuclear and non-nuclear Direct Material Inventory (DMI), Shop Stores/Mission Support Material Inventory, Unassigned Direct Material (UDM)/Future Use Material (FUM) inventory or residual/excess material carried by all four Naval Shipyards. Reference (b) promulgated associated business rules for redistribution of shared assets among Naval Shipyards.

2. The purpose of the SYTAV Program is threefold. It increases overall visibility of Navy Working Capital Fund and Mission Funded inventories while providing a mechanism for maximizing utilization of shipyard residual assets. It formalizes a process for effecting redistribution of shipyard assets in order to meet mission critical requirements. It ensures proper shipyard replenishment decisions by offsetting potential buys.

3. Each shipyard is required to execute the Navy Systems Support Group (NSSG) TAV scripts promulgated in reference (a). These scripts are designed to report all inventories in the Material Access Technology (MAT) database to include standard, non-standard, nuclear and non-nuclear. The inventory information is thereafter consolidated within SYTAV to provide claimancy-wide visibility in a secure environment located behind the Pearl Harbor Naval Shipyard and Intermediate Maintenance Facility firewall.

4. Please provide written positive confirmation that these scripts are in place and being executed nightly. The NAVSEA
